Despite a painful year for all those around the world from the COVID-19 pandemic, Yemen Aid welcomed an increase of revenue to support Yemen – the world’s worst humanitarian crisis recorded during this time.

For the last six years, Yemeni citizens have lived through suffering and conflict, leaving children to question their future. In a deteriorating economy, over twenty million Yemenis now rely on humanitarian assistance to survive. This devastating reality puts us in a position to find long-term solutions for Yemenis as we continue to support communities in need. 

# OUR WORK IN NUMBERS

Yemen Aid supported families in poverty, displaced families from conflict, and large communities across the country with short and long-term projects. In 2020, we have supported an estimated **500,000 individuals**, and **45 hospitals/medical centers**.



# ACCOUNTABILITY

Yemen Aid puts transparency as a priority for our donors and beneficiaries. We understand that charitable giving comes with trust and honesty which is why we have provided our legal and financial documents for easy access to the public on our website.

# COST-EFFECTIVENESS

Since our establishment in 2017, Yemen Aid has made every effort to reduce administrative expenses and to maximize aid. In 2018 and 2019, Yemen Aid spent over 90% in aid and less than 10% in administrative expenses.



## SUCCESS STORY

### A FARMER FINDS SUSTAINABLE SOLUTION FROM A GREENHOUSE

Mohamed, a farmer from the province of Dhamar, struggled with growing produce in difficult cold weather. This challenge impacted his family income, leaving the family struggling with basic necessities. Through our greenhouse project in Dhamar, he was trained and given the tools necessary to grow tomatoes in a quick and effective manner.

*I have never planted tomatoes before. However, in the first week we harvested about 6 baskets and then it increased to 9, and then 12 baskets. Now we have sustainable income because of our greenhouse.*

## OUR WORK IN SECTORS

## 1. HEALTH

Without adequate healthcare, citizens are at risk of illness. Amid the conflict in Yemen, the health sector is deteriorating daily and faces unprecedented challenges. Yemen Aid puts the health sector as a top priority and believes that the betterment of quality for Yemenis starts when the health sector runs effectively to serve the population as it should. In total, Yemen Aid supported over 400,000 beneficiaries.

## HIGHLIGHTS

- Medical shipments distributed to 45 hospitals and medical clinics across the country.
- Over 500 individuals supported by our Ambulance service program (EMS)
- Operational support of the 'Pink Clinic'- Breast Cancer Diagnosis Center which supported around 400 women
- Distributed 1,000 of PPE kits to frontline medical workers to support COVID-19 patients safely

# 2. FOOD SECURITY URGENT INTERVENTIONS

Over 15 million Yemenis, including children, are in need of humanitarian assistance. Nearly 2 million young children are malnourished and are in need of specific dietary needs and supervision. Yemen Aid distributed food baskets, bread and meat to families in need. In total, Yemen Aid supported 21,327 individuals in urgent intervention projects under this sector.

## HIGHLIGHTS

- Yemen Aid supplied Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) and poverty-stricken families with 1,068 food baskets
- Yemen Aid supplied IDPs 2,040 boxes of meat
- Yemen Aid supported 301 acutely malnourished children with tailored Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) food intervention



## OUR WORK IN SECTORS

3. **WASH**

Around 19 million Yemenis are water insecure – which is one of the main drivers of communal disease spread and poor hygiene conditions. Illnesses like Cholera, Dengue Fever and Acute Watery Diarrhea have been an ongoing threat to the health of Yemenis since 2014. Additionally, the COVID-19 pandemic has also put a strain on families in the country. This sector is considered a priority for Yemen Aid. Specifically, we promote solar panels as an effective solution to problems such as high cost of diesel which average families cannot afford. In total, Yemen Aid supported 73,500 individuals in over 20 villages with access to clean water.

## HIGHLIGHTS

- **Implementation of 29 medium and large Solar-Panel Water Wells**
- **Installation of water pipeline networks to communities and IDP hosting sites**
- **Rehabilitation of water reservoir tanks**

# 4. SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD

As part of our mission, we have approached Yemen's problems with real solutions that have components of skills, capacity building and awareness, coupled with sustainable goals. Our projects under sustainable livelihoods have an emphasis in the agricultural and livestock sectors.

## HIGHLIGHTS

- Implemented 19 greenhouses for farmers
- Distribution of Agricultural inputs; vegetable and cereal seeds, fertilizers & farming hand tools
- Distribution of small livestock to farmers

# 5. SHELTER AND NON-FOOD ITEMS (NFI)

## SUPPORTING 4,600 INDIVIDUALS

Due to ongoing conflict and natural weather disasters, Yemenis have been migrating within the country to new provinces and hosting sites. Throughout the migration, families have lost their homes, personal belongings and necessary items for daily activities. In this sector, Yemen Aid supported 1,900 beneficiaries.

### HIGHLIGHTS

- Distribution of 320 Winterization Kits
- Distribution of 110 Dignity Kits
- Distribution of 60 household items (NFI Kits)
- Providing clothes to 150 children
